

2010 Lawn Watering Schedule

Attention Customers: May 2010, ACWWA is implementing a Lawn Watering Schedule for its customers! Customers need to follow the every 3rd day watering schedule based on address (see full schedule on back side of this letter). More details below...

Arapahoe County Water and Wastewater Authority (ACWWA) has recently rolled out a number of new programs and projects intended to provide ACWWA customers high quality potable water for indoor use, and quality non-potable water for outdoor use. To maximize the utility and efficiency of these projects as they fully develop, ACWWA needs to manage the demand on its water system. Implementation of a Circle-Diamond-Square (every 3rd day) watering schedule will promote a more consistent demand on our system during the irrigation season, thus allowing ACWWA to maintain uninterrupted service to its customers.

What is a Circle-Diamond-Square watering schedule? It's an "every 3rd day" watering schedule. Which days your household or business can water are based on the numbers in your address. For example 1234 Main Street has the last two digits of its address as 34, based on the schedule on the back side of this letter, that would be a "diamond," and you would water on the days indicated by a diamond. If you have an automatic irrigation clock, this will require an adjustment to your clock. Most clocks can handle this irrigation schedule. Please contact our offices at 303-790-4830 if you have questions regarding this watering schedule.

ACWWA is keenly aware of the challenges our customers are dealing with during this economic recession, the development of this Lawn Watering Schedule is not intended to be an additional imposition on our customers, but a component that will allow ACWWA to maintain an efficient water management/operations program.

Using water efficiently is a benefit for all of us; ACWWA is working hard to provide its customers quality water in the most cost-efficient manner. Thank you for your consideration and we look forward to a good irrigation season!
