

2009 Lawn Watering Schedule

Attention Customers: Beginning May 1st and running through September 30th, ACWWA is implementing a Lawn Watering Schedule! Customers need to follow the Circle Diamond Square (every 3rd day) watering schedule based on their address (see full schedule on back side of this letter). More details below...

Arapahoe County Water and Wastewater Authority (ACWWA) is in final development of several projects with the end goal, to provide ACWWA customers high quality potable water for indoor use, and quality non-potable water for outdoor use. Construction of ACWWA's Joint Water Purification Project is currently underway which will provide a higher quality of potable water to our customers. In addition, ACWWA is also bringing its non-potable water program on line this year. These are highly complex projects and the management of our existing water supplies during their roll-out is critical. Implementation of a Circle Diamond Square (every 3rd day) watering schedule, will promote an even pattern of use of our water supply during the irrigation season, thus allowing ACWWA to maintain uninterrupted service to its customers in the most efficient manner.

What is a Circle Diamond Square (every 3rd day) watering schedule? It is a watering schedule where the days your household or business can water are based on the last two digits of your address. For example 1234 Main Street has the last two digits of its address as 34. The schedule on the back side of this letter correlates to a "diamond," and you would water on the days indicated by a "diamond." If you have an automatic irrigation clock, this will require an adjustment to your clock. Most clocks can handle this irrigation schedule.

ACWWA is keenly aware of the challenges our customers are dealing with during this economic recession. The development of this Lawn Watering Schedule is not intended to be an additional imposition on our customers, but a component that will support ACWWA's efforts to maintain an efficient water management/operations program. In the near future, information about a formal water conservation program will be rolled out which will also provide our customers tools to manage their individual water use in the most efficient manner.
